WORKSHOP LEADERS

Dr. Romi Mikulinsky

Romi Mikulinsky is the head of the Master of Design (MDes) program in Industrial Design and a senior lecturer at the Bezalel Academy of Arts and Design in Jerusalem. Her dissertation at the University of Toronto's English dept. was dedicated to photography, memory, and trauma in literature and film.

Dr. Mikulinsky researches and lectures about digital and counter-culture, algorithmic art, as well as design-led innovation. Since 2018 she is leading the collaboration with the Design Lab (DLX) at the University of Tokyo and since 2019 spearheads Bezalel's smart mobility collaboration with UTokyo Labs (see website: https://www.future-mobility.design). She is a member of the organizing committee for "Planning and Policy of Mobility and Smart Cities" of Israel's national research center of smart mobility. A member at the steering committee of the Tech-Meets Design Jerusalem Consortium (https://www.jlmtechmeets.design/) and a steering committee member of the "Design Value in the StartUp Nation" report commissioned by Start Up Nation Central.

Romi has over 20 years of experience in Israeli and International industry: she has worked with various start-up companies and media websites, corporations and municipalities on the implementation of technological innovation across the organization and has international experience in leading design and innovation workshops (Australia, Japan, and in several countries across Europe). She served as the Director of The Shpilman Institute for Photography and worked with various art museums in Israel.

Eng. Rinat Sherzer

Rinat Sherzer is an interdisciplinary biotech engineer, service design strategist, social entrepreneur & educator, tackling complex social issues around equality, diversity and inclusion.

She has over 15 years of experience working at the intersection of tech, human centered design & social good. She was chosen by the UN to speak in the UN Women Summit, March 2020 for Women's International Day.

Rinat is the founder of Of Course Global, a social innovation design consultancy, bringing service design, innovation and social impact to businesses. Among their clients are: Capital One, Pfizer and the Swiss Government. Previously she co-founded a real-tech startup, fisbo. Prior to her independent path she globally launched MediaMind's flagship product and led the product's User Experience field. Following that the company was acquired for \$517M, one of Israel's largest exits at the time.

After 7 years in NY, she is returning to Israel to lead the Design & Innovation Management track in Bezalel. She teaches at Parsons School of Design, NY and has previously taught and guest lectured in: Harvard, Columbia University, NYU, University of Pennsylvania, Cornell University, Cooper Hewitt, School of Visual Arts, Rhode Island School of Design, Brown University, College for Creative studies and Universidad San Francisco de Quito.

Rinat is a passionate keynote speaker. In her practice, Rinat combines principles from Biomimicry & Human Centered Design to create a cultural shift towards an egalitarian society by exploring the menstrual cycle and de-shaming it, which she explained further in her TEDx Talk.

Rinat holds a Bachelor's degree in Biotechnology Engineering from Ben-Gurion University, Israel and an MFA in Design for Social Innovation from SVA, NY.

She mentors humans from all over the world, helping them reclaim their power.
